About the Opportunity:

Under the London Olympic Games and Paralympic Games Act 2006, the ODA is responsible for controlling the street traders around the 28 Olympic and Paralympic Zones during the Games. This control involves ensuring that the Traders located in open public spaces close to the vicinity of the Zones are authorised to trade in these areas during the games. Traders not authorised to trade in these areas are refused a license and cannot trade in these areas during the Games.

Description The ODA Legal Team (Advertising and Trading Regulations) is required to capture, manage and report against the application processes made for trading during the Games. The process is defined by ODA's Advertising and Trading Regulations.

The objectives of the project are to develop a database to manage the information used for the application processes. The database is to be used by up to 5 users from the ODA's Advertising and Trading Team. It will not be accessed by non ODA personnel. It will also contain personal and confidential information about the Traders and the database will need to have suitable and appropriate security around it.

The ODA has partly developed a database using Microsoft Access. It is seeking assistance from an experienced Access developer to complete the database, assist with testing, prepare user guides and provide ongoing ad hoc advice.

About the buyer's selection process:

The Olympic Delivery Authority will award contracts to businesses that reflect London 2012's procurement policies and values. Value for money on costs, time, quality, design and functionality, the promotion of equality and diversity, environmental responsibility, and legacy are key values that embody the ODA's procurement objectives.

Following shortlisting conducted on the CompeteFor system, you will be required to submit a quote directly to the ODA project manager. You will be instructed further on this process following shortlisting.

During the procurement process suppliers may be required to provide supporting evidence within 24 hours, there may also be an additional stage added following shortlisting and prior to the quotation stage.

Post the Tender closing date, all suppliers will be notified of their status via email and will be able to view who the opportunity was awarded to.

About the buyer:

The Olympic Delivery Authority (ODA) is the public body responsible for developing and building the new venues and infrastructure for the 2012 Olympic Games and their use after 2012. The ODA buys goods, services and works ranging from construction, engineering and manufacturing to creative, merchandising and retail.
